

One Little, Two Little, Three Little Petals...

Ideas using the new Petal Multi-Maker

You can use the Flip Flop method to create off-set petals by using a 2" or wider strip and flipping the paper over after each punch. The bottom Apricot border uses the technique of making a petal punch, then lining up the two side petals with the previous petal holes and



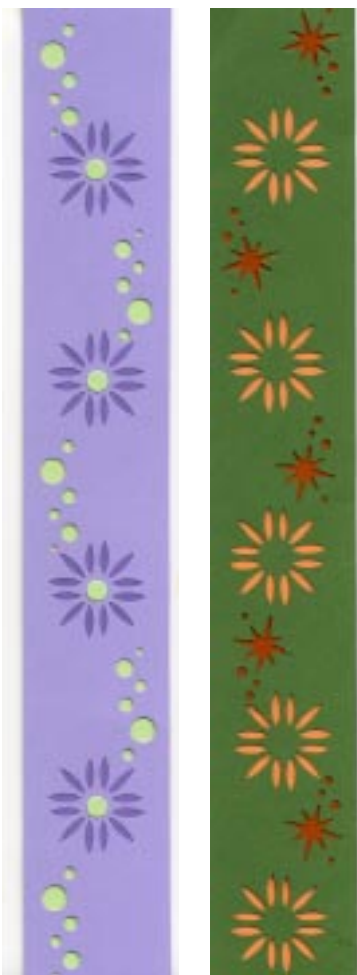
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Also, the Happy Holiday border is an adaptation from another CMC, whom I don't know, but I wanted to acknowledge her for the inspiration.



punching. It creates the lacy looking border to the right. Some of the petal borders have a center made with a plain hole punch. *Tip:* Put Photo Tape on the back of the photo mounting paper before punching the small dots, making it very easy to adhere them, or use the new Adhesive Pen.





The Petal Maker works well with the other Makers, as three of these borders show. I really like the effect of the Bubble Maker and the Disney Magic Maker with the Petal Maker. Also, after punching out a petal, use the Shape Makers to surround it with a circle, square, hexagon or even a heart. On the green border I cut a piece of CM photo mounting paper 1 3/4" wide, centered it and made my petal punch. Then I cut the 1 3/4" strip into a 1 3/4" square and corner cut each of the corners with the petal corner cutter. The scanning cut off the edges of the green strip, as they too are corner cut with petals.
